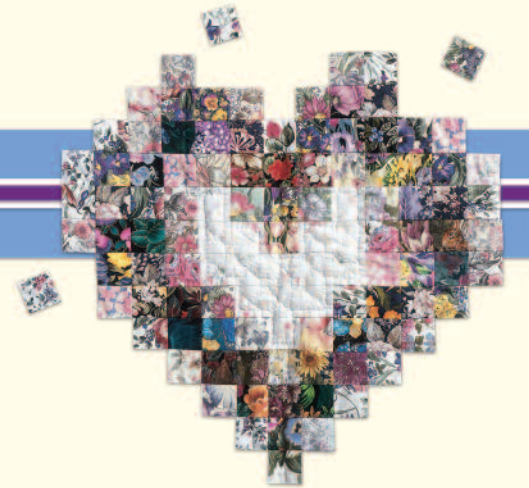

Directions to Yale's West Campus

Coming from the South:

Take I-95 north to exit 41 (Marsh Hill Rd). At the end of the ramp go straight through the light. This is Frontage Road and the entrance ramp to I-95 northbound. Stay in the right lane and bear right at the fork, staying in the right lane. Follow the Yale event signs.

Coming from the North:

Take I-95 south to exit 41 (Marsh Hill Rd). At the light at the end of the exit ramp take a left onto Marsh Hill Road. At the next traffic light, take a left onto the Frontage Road/I-95 northbound entrance ramp. Follow this to the fork and stay in the right lane. Follow the Yale event signs.
